KAI Accreditation Course Timetable

The online KAI Accreditation Course is offered in a blended format, with times for live discussion, and times for studying on your own. In a period of two weeks, it offers 35 instructional hours, in addition to pre-course work, and homework during the course.

While the two-week hybrid model offers flexibility for you, keep in mind there will be daily assignments and continual work on your final assignment. Each day builds on learning as preparation for the next day. It is recommended to greatly reduce your work schedule during the two-week period.
